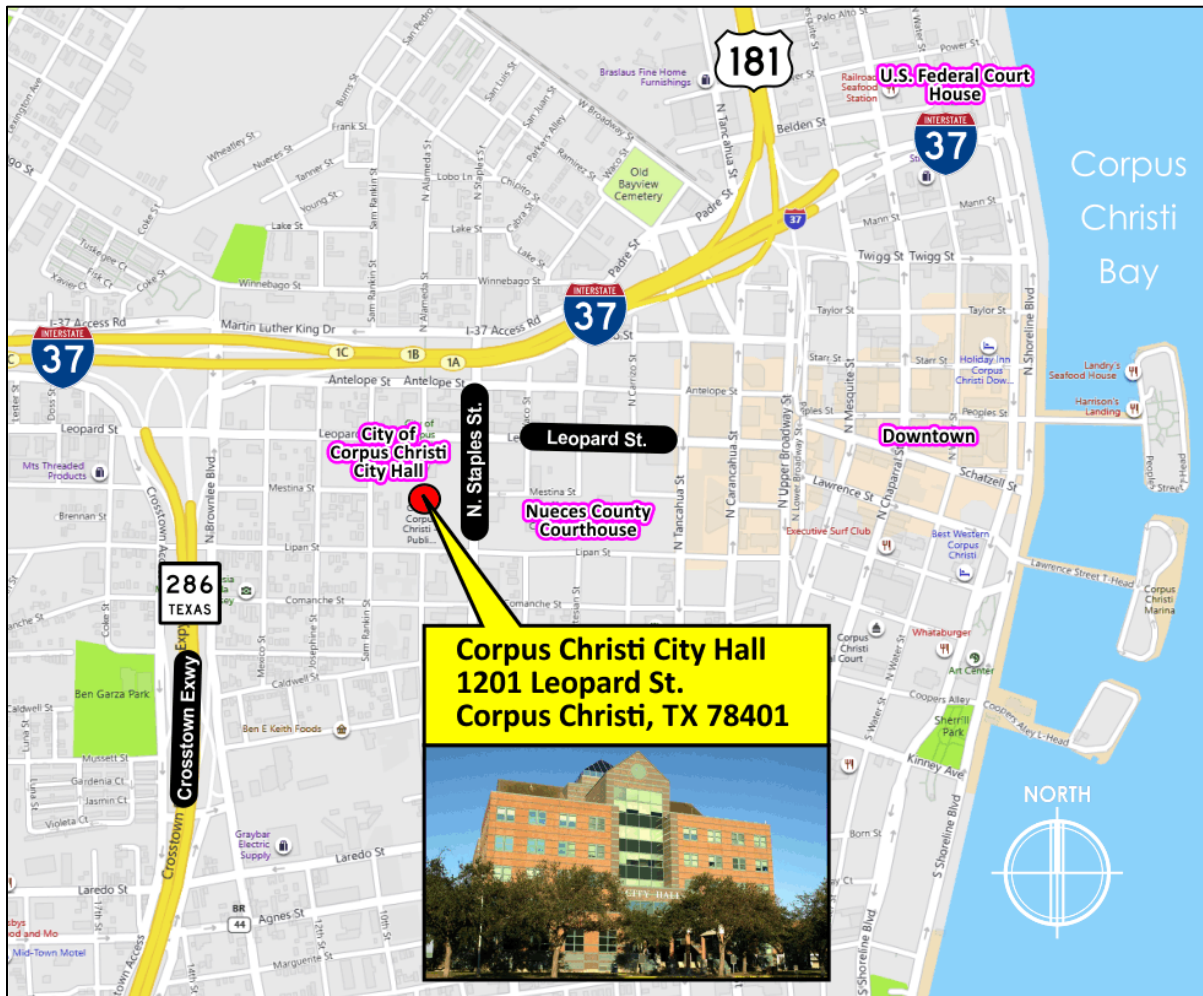

October 3, 2019

1. Call to Order, Roll Call, and Quorum Determination

TPC Chair Judge Krebs called the meeting to order at 2:01 p.m. at the City of Corpus Christi Council Chambers.

2. Introduction of Visiting Agency Officials

Mr. MacDonald introduced Mr. Craig Casper, the Corpus Christi MPO's new Senior Transportation Planner who has extensive experience in transportation planning. Mr. Casper is the former Planning Director of Greater Nashville Regional Council in Tennessee and he previously worked for the Pikes Peak Area Council of Government in Colorado as a Transportation Director.

3. Public Comments for items not on the Agenda

Judge Krebs called for public comments for items not on the agenda; None were offered.

4. Approval of the September 5, 2019 TPC Regular Meeting Minutes

Judge Canales made a motion to approve the September 5, 2019, TPC Meeting Minutes. Mayor Skurow seconded; motion passed unanimously.

5. Discussion and Possible Action

A. 2020-2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) DRAFT Fiscally Constrained Project List for MPO Funding

Mr. MacDonald presented the enhanced 2020-2045 MTP DRAFT Fiscally Constrained Project List for MPO Funding. Mr. MacDonald first informed the TPC members that the Dr Hector P Garcia Park Hike & Bike Trail: Phase II project's limit was from Garcia on Trojan Drive to Horne Road. Then he explained that (1) the list includes the project ranking, (2) all projects are categorized either TIP/STIP, 10-year Plan, or Long-Range, (3) the Total Project Cost includes an additional 20% for non-construction cost and the Total Project Cost of programs in the TIP/STIP planning period are inflated 4% per year for two years, but projects in the 10-year Plan and Long-Range period are not inflated, (4) two Transportation Alternatives Program projects (TAP: Category 9) from previous Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) were added to TIP/STIP planning period, (5) funding for these two TAP projects was deducted from Category 9 funding pool, (6) the City of Corpus Christi requested to categorize SS 544 (Agnes Street/Laredo Street) and the NEPA study for the Regional Parkway Segment B as TIP/STIP however; since the MPO's Category 7 funding is currently pledged to the Harbor Bridge Relocation Program and the final funding amount is not yet available, these two projects are categorized as 10-year plan until

the available Category 7 funding is determined, and (7) the project list is in the planning period order based on the September 19th TAC regular and 26th TAC Special Meeting recommendation.

Mayor McComb inquired on the status of the crosswalk on Schanen Ditch Hike & Bike Trails at Saratoga Boulevard. Ms. Munoz, Assistant Director of Street Operations answered that the City of Corpus Christi was currently working on a crosswalk design and would provide a presentation once a design was determined.

Mayor McComb made a motion to approve the 2020-2045 MTP DRAFT Fiscally Constrained Project List for MPO Funding. Mr. Olivarez, Jr., seconded: motion passed unanimously.

B. FY 2019-2022 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment

Mr. MacDonald informed TPC members that the Portland Bicycle Lanes project was programmed in FY 2017 in the FY 2017-2019 TIP. This project is ready to be let and needs to be included in current FY 2019-2022 TIP to receive the federal funding.

Judge Canales made a motion to approve amending the FY 2019-2022 TIP by adding the Portland Bicycle Lanes project. Mr. Martinez seconded; motion passed unanimously.

C. 2020-2045 MTP Appendix #: TxDOT 2020 Unified Transportation Program (UTP)

Mr. MacDonald submitted the TAC recommendation to include TxDOT 2020 UTP Corpus Christi District pages in 2020-2045 MTP as an appendix.

Mr. Martinez made a motion to approve to include TxDOT's 2020 UTP as an appendix in the 2020-2045 MTP. Judge Canales seconded; motion passed unanimously.

D. 2020-2045 MTP Appendix #: Strategic Plan for Active Mobility: Phase 1: Bicycle Mobility Plan

Mr. MacDonald submitted the TAC recommendation to include the Strategic Plan for Active Mobility as appendix in the 2020-2045 MTP. The Plan was adopted by the City of Corpus Christi in 2016 but not officially included in the 2015-2040 MTP. The MPO is planning to start redeveloping a new comprehensive mobility plan next year.

Judge Canales thanked the efforts of the MPO, City of Corpus Christi, and City of Portland in collaboratively promoting active mobility and wellness for the people in the community, and that Nueces County will join the effort.

Mr. MacDonald stated that the MPO will work closely with partner agencies to develop the new mobility plan that includes all modes and infrastructure, such as bicycle, pedestrian, ADA and so forth.

Mayor Skurow made a motion to approve to include Strategic Plan for Active Mobility as an appendix in 2020-2045 MTP. Mr. Olivarez, Jr., seconded; motion passed unanimously.

6. Information Only

A. 2020-2045 MTP Development Working Schedule Monthly Update

Mr. MacDonald provided the TPC members with the updated 2020-2045 MTP development working schedule. The Corpus Christi MPO will hold a second public meeting on October 24th at Portland City Hall Council Chambers, and the third public meeting on November 13th at the Anita & W. T. Neyland Public Library. The entire DRAFT 2020-2045 MTP is expected to be presented to the TAC in November and to the TPC in December for an approval.

Summary

The Corpus Christi MPO staff continues to develop the various Chapters of the 2020-2045 MTP for review by the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC), Transportation Policy Committee (TPC), our partner agencies and the public. We are providing the TPC with the following chapters for your review, discussion, and actions. Different 2020-2045 Chapters have varied proposed actions depending on their state of development and review. Below are the chapters with their proposed actions identified:

- Chapter 1: Introduction** – minor revisions were completed. We recommend approval by the TPC.
- Chapter 2: Planning Requirements Agency Coordination and Public Outreach.** We recommend TPC approval for public comment.
- Chapter 3: Planning Framework.** We recommend TPC approval for public comment.
- Chapter 4: Demographics and Forecasting.** We recommend TPC approval for public comment.
- Chapter 6: Financial Plan.** We recommend TPC approval for public comment.
- Chapter 7: Implementation Plan.** We recommend TPC approval for public comment.
- Chapter 14: Air Quality Analysis** – minor revisions were completed. We recommend approval by the TPC.

Given the need for the MPO to approve the 2020-2045 MTP in January, we are pushing forward with the document chapters to be made available to the public, TAC and TPC at about the same time. The information in the 2020-2045 MTP Chapters are the collection of data and analysis required under the federal planning laws and regulations. This information is a collection of existing information that was available on the TxDOT and local governments websites and are being collected and organized into the MPO document. We believe that the information is only being reorganized from information already in the public domain, not new calculations, policy or information related to our regional transportation plan. We are seeking the input from the TPC, TAC, partner agencies and the public on the presentation of the reorganized information that is our 2020-2045 MTP.

Summary

As part of the continuous regional and state planning processes for transportation projects and programs, the Corpus Christi MPO will be part of the upcoming TxDOT process to develop the 2021 Unified Transportation Program (UTP). Earlier this month, TxDOT provided an overview of the 2021 UTP. This UTP process overview presentation is attached for your review.

The TPC recently approved the list of transportation projects for the 2020-2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) including projects funded by Categories 2, 4 and 12. These categories are the focus of the 2021 UTP development process. The list of projects identified for Category 2, 4 and 12 in the MPO's 2020-2045 MTP is attached for your review.

As the 2021 UTP process develops, we will request updates from TxDOT staff and provide information to the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) and TPC as necessary. Future agenda items will be brought to the TAC and TPC for discussion and action as the process proceeds.

Alternatives

None. This is an Information Only Item.

Financial Impact

None at this time. We anticipate there will be future impacts to local government and agency budgets for matching funds to the transportation federal funds for selected projects in the 2021 UTP.

Recommendation

MPO staff recommends that the TPC review the information and provide comments to MPO staff and TxDOT staff regarding the process for developing the 2021 UTP. The MPO TAC will receive the same information for their review and comment regarding how the Corpus Christi MPO should interact with the TxDOT process for developing the 2021 UTP.

Background

House Bill 20 (HB 20), as passed by the 84th Legislature, required changes to several of the planning and programming processes that the Texas Transportation Commission (TTC), TxDOT, and planning organizations use to prioritize and finance transportation projects. As related to the UTP, HB 20 includes several key planning and programming provisions. These include:

- Development and implementation of performance metrics and measures as part of the department's planning processes
- Development of 10-year programming using plans of MPOs and TxDOT districts
- Adoption of rules by the TTC for project prioritization and performance-based funding processes

Texas Administrative Code (TAC) Rule §16.105, was updated in 2017 and 2018 to align with HB 20. It specifies that "An MPO may annually reevaluate the status of project priorities and selection in its approved metropolitan transportation plan (MTP) and transportation improvement program (TIP) and provide a report of changes to the department...The reevaluation must be consistent with criteria applicable to the development of the MTP and TIP". The UTP covers a period of 10 years to guide the development and authorize statewide transportation projects. Some performance based project selection requirements include:

- Consider the potential for the project to meet transportation goals for the state
- Project will be ranked within its applicable program funding category (Cat 2, 4, & 12), using a performance-based scoring system, and classified as tier one, tier two, or tier three for ranking purposes
- The scoring system will prioritize projects for which financial assistance is sought from the commission
- Must account for the diverse needs of the state so as to fairly allocate funding to all regions

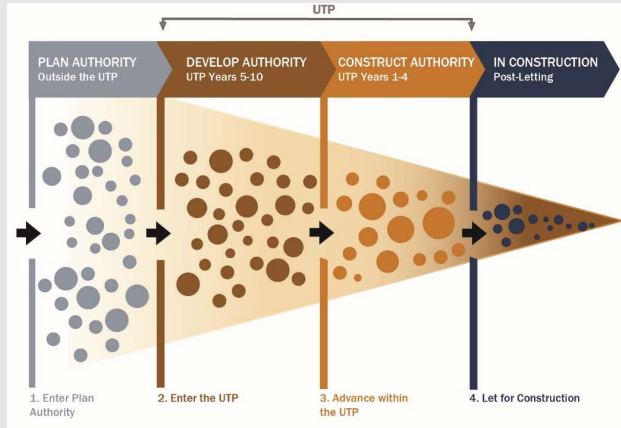

Texas Administrative Code (TAC): Rule §16.105

TAC Rule §16.105, was updated in 2017 and 2018 to align with HB 20. The UTP covers a period of 10 years to guide the development and authorize statewide transportation projects. Some performance based project selection requirements include:

- Consider the potential for the project to meet transportation goals for the state
- Project will be ranked within its applicable program funding category (Cat 2, 4, & 12), using a performance-based scoring system, and classified as tier one, tier two, or tier three for ranking purposes
- The scoring system will be used for prioritizing projects for which financial assistance is sought from the commission
- Must account for the diverse needs of the state so as to fairly allocate funding to all regions

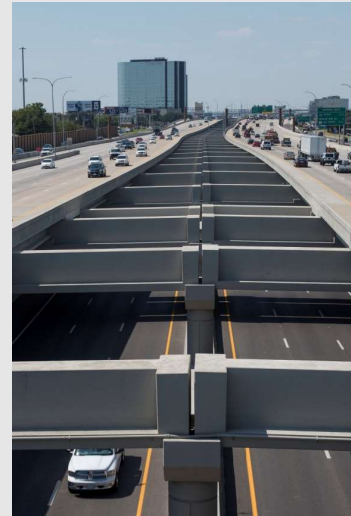

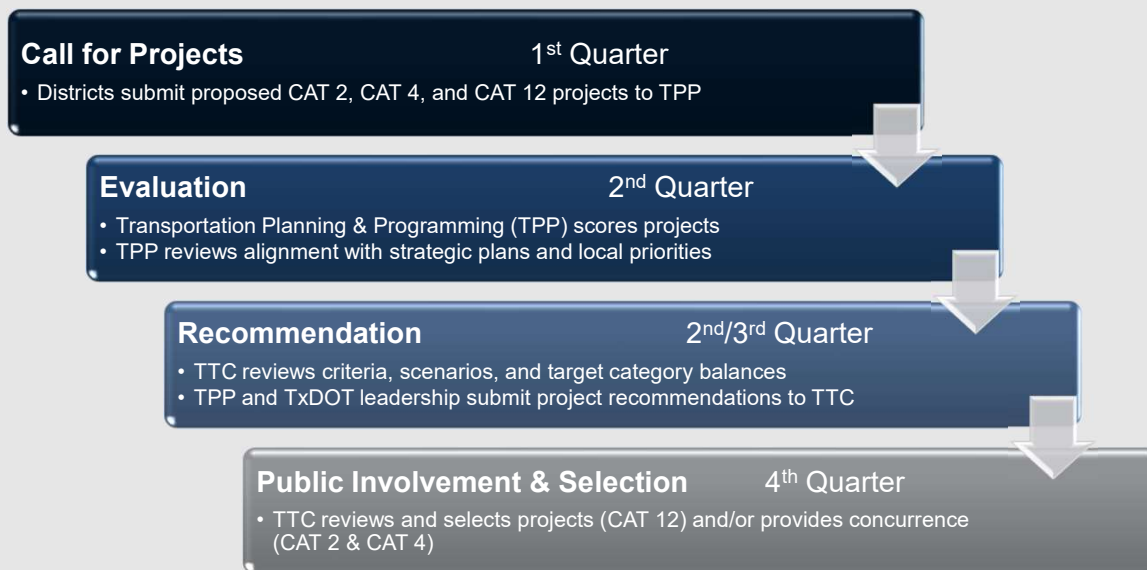
Project Scoring, Formula, & Allocation

- Recommended projects from Categories 2, 4U, 4R, and 12 are scored during the UTP project selection process and listed individually in the UTP. These categories of funding are focused on mobility projects, which improve connectivity and relieve congestion throughout the state.
- Category 2 Metropolitan and Urban Corridor Projects - will be allocated to MPOs following a formula defined in TAC rule §16.154.
- Category 4 Statewide Connectivity Corridor Projects - will be allocated to districts as an allocation program for specific corridors selected by the commission based on engineering analysis of three corridor types and, if applicable to the particular corridor type, considering the formula specified in TAC rule §16.154.
- Category 12 Strategic Priority - for specific projects including Texas Clear Lanes and is allocated using a non-formula allocation that the Commission determines.



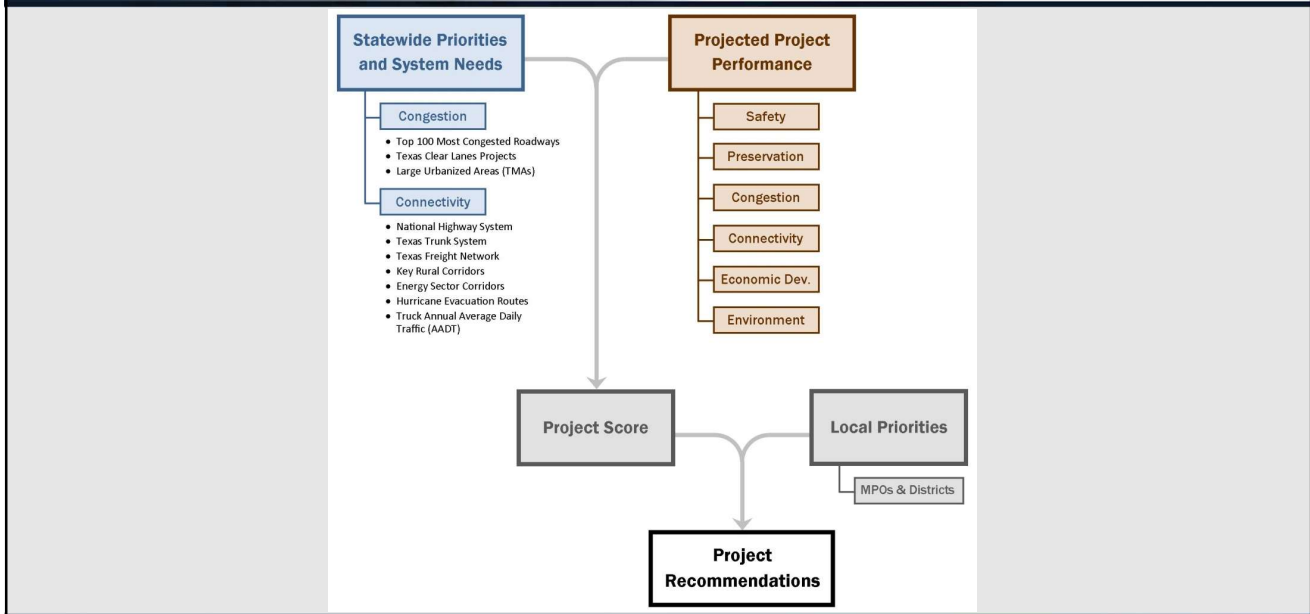
